

**Preliminary Kitsap County Shoreline Environment Designation Map - Revisions to First Draft**

Map revisions are listed below under "Puget Sound" and "Hood Canal", generally from north to south.

NOTE: The green colors have been revised for this draft to show Natural (most protective) as dark green and Rural Conservancy (less restrictive) as light green.

**Puget Sound**

Point No Point wetland	Added as Shoreline Jurisdiction	Tidally influenced wetland/floodplain
N. Carpenter Estuary above W. Kingston Rd.	Added Natural	Unintentionally excluded on first draft
Suquamish	Rural Cons. > Parallel Des. Urban Cons./Shoreline Res.	In LAMIRD, should be Urban Cons.; slopes w/ residential upland (similar to Illahee)
N. Brownsville/S. Keyport, portion from Solar View to Aquila Pl.	Rural Conservancy > Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions; slopes
S. Illahee (S.Rue Villa)	Shoreline Res. > Urban Cons. (extended north from state park boundary to end of Rue Villa neighborhood)	Wetland/floodplain; adjacent to Illahee Greenbelt
Inside W. Phinney Bay	Urban Cons. > Shoreline Res.	Recognizes the existing development pattern and proximity of primary structures to the shoreline; provides consistency with the City of Bremerton Shoreline Designations
Gorst (marine)	High Intensity > Parallel Des. Urban Conservancy/High Intensity	Provides consistency with City of Bremerton; recognizes both the sensitive habitat and existing intensive commercial and transportation uses
Gorst (creek)	Added High Intensity	Unintentionally excluded on first draft; buffer same for all SMP stream shorelines
S. Sinclair Inlet, between Bremerton and Port Orchard	High Intensity > Urban Cons.	Includes portion of Hwy 16, but is otherwise intact
Beach Drive Tidal marsh	Added as Shoreline Jurisdiction as Urban Conservancy behind the road	Recognizes the tidal marsh behind Beach Drive in the Port Orchard UGA as Shoreline Jurisdiction
Fragaria	Shoreline Res. > Rural Cons.	Recognizes existing development pattern but also acknowledges steep, unstable slopes and estuary
Burley Lagoon, West Shore	Rural Cons. > Natural	Recognizes existing generally intact condition, wetlands
Blake Island, SW portion	Expanded Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing generally intact conditions; regulations give special consideration to State Parks for trails and necessary access roads; Aquatic designation covers moorage area

**Hood Canal**

Twin Spits - South end of S. Spit	Shoreline Res. > Rural Cons.	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions
Driftwood Keys	Rural Cons. > Shoreline Res.	Recognizes the existing development pattern and proximity of primary structures to the shoreline; exception to criteria because of existing floodplain
Gamble Bay, W. Shore	Rural Cons. > Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions and ecological functions; would not preclude conditional use residential development or forest practices
Port Gamble	High Intensity > Urban Cons.	Urban Conservancy purpose statement more appropriately matches the Port Gamble LAMIRD plan in KCC 17.321B; recognizes floodplain
Seabeck Conference Center tidal pond	Added Rural Conservancy	Unintentionally excluded; tidally influenced pond
West of Stavis Bay, eastern portion before Hood Pt.	Rural Cons. > Natural (except one parcel)	Slopes; more appropriately recognizes existing conditions
Nellita Area, various	Rural Cons. > Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions
Tekiu Point	Rural Cons. > Natural	Inadvertently mislabeled; more appropriately recognizes existing conditions and practices of neighborhood group
South of Tekiu Pt., portion	Rural Cons. > Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions
S. Hood Canal/Manke	Rural Cons. > Natural	More appropriately recognizes existing conditions; would not preclude conditional use forest practices
