

# SHORELINE MASTER PROGRAM PRELIMINARY SHORELINE JURISDICTION DRAFT MAPPING

## KITSAP COUNTY

Washington

WAC 173.18-040: Streams and Rivers.  
The provisions of this chapter define the streams and rivers which constitute shorelines of the state.

WAC 173.20-030: Lakes.  
The provisions of this chapter define the lakes and water bodies which constitute shorelines of the state.

WAC 173.22-030: Shorelands and Associated Wetlands.  
The provisions of this chapter define the Shoreland areas, Associated wetlands, and Floodways which constitute shorelines of the state.

The green layer, "MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS", consists of the following features:  
Lakes over 20 acres, plus a 200 foot jurisdictional boundary.  
Marine Shorelands (a 200 foot jurisdictional boundary from the marine shoreline), Associated wetlands, Floodways; and a 200 foot jurisdictional boundary for the floodways.

The red layer, "OPTIONAL FEMA FLOODWAYS AND FLOODPLAINS" consists of those floodways and floodplains that exist on streams with a flow of less than 20 cfs+, and are not associated with the previously established features listed in the green layer.

- LAKES AND PONDS 20 AC +**  
The Shoreline Management Act applies to lakes and reservoirs greater than 20 acres in area. The determination is defined by a continuous ordinary high water mark and may include vegetated areas and open water areas. The position of the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM) in relation to extreme high and extreme low water varies from site to site. The OHWM will vary over time and according to factors such as wind, waves, erosion, accretion, soils, substrate, vegetation, land use changes, runoff, groundwater, presence of peat, constancy of pool elevations, and the activities of beavers and other organisms.
- MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS (updated 11-09-09)**  
Statutory minimum areas consisting of the following Shorelines, Shorelands of Statewide Significance and Shorelands (per RCW 60.58.030(2)):  
Marine shorelines, Rivers and streams with mean annual flow over 20 cubic feet per second, Lakes and reservoirs exceeding 20 acres.  
Associated wetlands of these areas, and lands extending landward 200 feet from the ordinary high water mark, floodways and floodplain areas landward 200 feet from the ordinary high water mark.
- OPTIONAL FEMA FLOODWAYS AND FLOODPLAINS**  
These are added to show the floodplains that exist:  
1. Above the 20 cfs location on those streams with a 20 cfs point.  
2. On all streams that are below the 20 cfs flow rate.  
3. Outside of the 200 foot Floodway Jurisdictional Boundary
